His successors, Jagadguru Sri Jayendra Saraswati and Sri Sankara Vijayendra, also gave abundant blessings. Jayendra sanctified with holy ash the temple's navaratna (nine gems traditionally placed below the main sanctum), which was later placed in the foundation on Kauai. In September, 1998, the pontiff conveyed to Kauai his "choicest blessings for the successful completion of this sacred endeavor."1Ã\[14\]
